Stories include age appropriate information about Native American perspectives. Students will learn about how human actions effect the environment, ecosystems, & experience a live dramatic performance.

2ND GRADE ZOO ADVENTURE \$ 572.00 CLARINDA HARDY

A trip to the Caldwell Zoo brings second grade life science TEKS to life. Seeing is believing! Observing the actual living animals, compared to simply reading words about them, is a priceless experience. This trip impacts 220 second grade students.

EXPERIENCING ART BREAK \$1,438.75 SHELLEY GOOLSBY

This grant is for 3 classroom sets (90 books) of award-winning literature accompanied by the book tape. Research shows reading with professional readers increases students' fluency & vocabulary while they learn more about Antarctica, Mexico, and Ancient Greece. Impacts 6th grade (193).

A MEDIEVAL ADVENTURE \$5,000.00 JANET SIMS

A trip to Medieval Times in Dallas enables 6th grade students (163) to transfer their study of the Middle Ages--the feudal system, foods, knights, castles, heraldry, & weaponry--into a direct application of their knowledge. For many, travel to a large city is an important experience in itself. Grant funds transportation, mechanic, half of admission fees.

Following a 2-week study of opera as an art form, 4th-5th-6th grade students will enjoy a live performance by the Shreveport Opera Express in the CJHS auditorium. Impacts 609.
